The top A Level students aced the new A Level examinations to show that Warrington continues to send some of its brightest young minds to the Catholic grammar school in Altrincham.

Pauline added after revealing a 70% A\* to B rate with 39% at the top A\* or A grades at the leading Catholic grammar school in Hale Barns, “this traditionally favours boys’ style of learning, but it still demands a certain resolve in the examination room and a determination to rise to the challenge while revising.”

Pauline added: “These are among our best ever results and shows how readily staff and students have embraced what has been a quite considerable change. Warrington has once again done us proud.”
