GUIDANCE FOR STUDENTS SITTING MOCK GCSE EXAMINATIONS:

This is an important opportunity for you to experience an intense week of examining to prepare you for the summer examinations.

All examinations will take place in the Humanities classrooms unless otherwise indicated – Spanish & French listening will take place within the normal timetable.

You are required to be punctual for each examination and to attend in full school uniform. If you are unwell and not able to attend school during any time of the examination week you MUST telephone the College before 08:45 to inform us of your absence.

The **Art examination** will be in the Art room on Tuesday 13th Dec and continue in subsequent lessons.

EXAMINATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AS GIVEN BY THE JOINT COUNCIL for QUALIFICATIONS (JCQ)

Warning to Candidates

1. You must be on time for all your examinations.
2. You must not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
3. You must not:
 - sit an examination in the name of another candidate;
 - have in your possession any unauthorised material or equipment which might give you an unfair advantage.
4. Possession of a mobile phone or other unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification. (see below).
5. You must not talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.
6. You must follow the instructions of the invigilator.
7. If you are in any doubt speak to the invigilator.
