EXAMINATION RULES AND REGULATIONS AS GIVEN BY THE JOINT COUNCIL for QUALIFICATIONS (JCQ)

Warning to Candidates

1. You must be on time for all your examinations.
2. You must not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
3. You must not:
 - sit an examination in the name of another candidate;
 - have in your possession any unauthorised material or equipment which might give you an unfair advantage.
4. Possession of a mobile phone or other unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification. (see below).
