DESCRIPTION OF POST

The successful candidate must be willing to engage St Ambrose College's commitment to developing an outstanding Catholic Boys' Grammar School.

A well qualified and enthusiastic linguist specializing in French to A level (with the possibility of offering Spanish/Latin as a second language) is required to join our successful Languages Department within this selective Boys' Grammar School, described as "outstanding" in the most recent Ofsted inspection.

The candidate should be able to deliver the subject in an enthusiastic way which will encourage the development of a real enjoyment of the subject and an understanding of the importance of languages in today's society. The candidate will be expected to help organise revision sessions and other extra curricular trips and activities.

The faculty comprises of the subject areas of French, Spanish and Latin. Languages are a core element at Key Stage 3, with French taught in Year 7 and Spanish and Latin introduced in Year 8. All three subjects are taught to GCSE level and French, Spanish and Latin at A-level. The Faculty has committed and enthusiastic subject specialists and is accommodated in dedicated teaching rooms.

DESCRIPTION OF POST to join the Languages Faculty and ensure the delivery of a challenging curriculum to meet the individual needs of all students and to raise the attainment of all learners.

- Attending INSET courses and to encourage departmental members to do so.
- To liaise with parents over issues relating to the subject
- Carrying out such duties as reasonably requested by the Principal.
- To teach a timetable as allocated.
- To set, record and mark homework as designated.
- To give written reports on the progress of students throughout the year as requested by the Principal.
- To attend parents' evenings and any other occasion sanctioned by the College, e.g. Options Evenings, New Parents' Evening, Open Days, Presentation Evening, etc.
- To promote the development of each pupil's spiritual, moral, social and cultural welfare.
- To uphold the Catholic ethos of the College and to support the application of the Eight Essentials of Edmund Rice.
- To produce and adapt work schemes relevant to the key stages.
- To mark student's work and provide feedback to ensure good progress.
- To support the daily life of St Ambrose College.
