## **Sports News**

This week has seen many successes for College sports teams. In Rugby Sevens the College Under 15 team won the Myles Marshall King's Macclesfield Sevens, continuing their success at Audenshaw. They made this a hatrick of successes on Wednesday with victory in the County Sevens. The margin of victory in the final against King's Macclesfield was indicative of their dominance in the tournament.

The Under 14 team won their first tournament at Wirral G.S defeating a strong London Oratory team in the final but winning matches against strong County sides. Our Under 13 Sevens team travelled down to a Berkhamsted Waterfall tournament and returned with medals winning 4 out of their six fixtures in a tournament of over 100 school teams from all over Great Britain. 
