offer a taste of university physics, with undergraduates on-hand to talk to the winning students; they often including an evening of hands-on science demonstrations and a lecture.

Primary School Maths Challenge

'Chatting in class' was the secret to St. Anne's Church of England Primary School's success in the biggest and best ever St. Ambrose College Trafford Primary Schools' Mathematics Challenge.

Brilliant young mathematician Dylan Egglestone, just one of a quartet of exceptional 10-year-old calculators from the Sale school, admitted after receiving the winning certificates on a sun soaked day: "We chatted to each other all day and worked out the answers between us; it was fun to work as a team."

There was no complaint from co-organiser Head of Maths Mr

There was no complaint from co-organiser Head of Maths Mr Chapman, who said: "That's exactly the sort of skill we want to encourage: collaborative, conscientious, creative team-working with purpose and point."

It all added up to a record number of schools and a record number of contestants, with 136 children, from a stunning 34 schools from right across the borough taking part, an increase, for the mathematicians, of nearly 25% on the previous highest turnout.

There were five rounds covering a relay round, a kinaesthetic puzzle round, a treasure hunt, a number puzzle, and an Ipad round. If it sounds like child's play then tackle this one: 'Dolly's age is the reverse number of her aunt Ada's age and is six elevenths of the difference: What are their ages?"

Lottie Nicol said: "I love the fact that there are so many different

types of Maths. You can be good at fractions and still be confident in that area even if you find other aspects difficult at first."

Daisy Lloyd said: "I like the complexity of the puzzle and the challenge of working out the answer."

Young philosopher Shiv Ahuja, added: "There is no limit or boundary to maths; there are just limitless possibilities in maths."

Andy Chapman added: "Every member of the St. Ambrose maths department' contributes to making this a very special day

for all of us. Working with such

fertile and receptive young minds is always a sheer delight." Still struggling: The answer is 27 and 72.




