



4th Year Historians will be expected to revise

- a) Elizabeth I including the study of Hardwick Hall
- b) Germany 1890 -1945 Democracy and Dictatorship.

- Revision tips:

- Historians are advised to plan their History revision by breaking up the specification into manageable chunks. (Copy attached. Please refer to Paper One Germany 1890 – 1945 and Paper Two: Elizabeth only. Keep a copy of the whole specification which will be needed for end of unit tests, mock exams and the GCSE next year)
- Those students who have opted to buy the revision guides can start by using the appropriate pages of the guide and completing the exercises. (The revision guide is however, only a starting point)
- The **main resources** for students to use are their exercise books and end of unit tests. Students need to be aware of the style of question and the success criteria.
- Over the Easter period, Students will be able to use their copy of the Elizabethan textbook (red) to revise from. There are examples of practice questions and model answers throughout the textbook . I suggest that if students feel there are any gaps in their books that they take further notes whilst they still have access to the textbook.
- Students should also study the information on Hardwick Hall and the National Trust. (Copy attached).

Hardwick Hall. Students will be expected to answer a question on Hardwick Hall on the Elizabethan Paper. Whilst visiting the site is by no means a requirement , it may be that students could visit the Hall during their Easter or Summer holidays. As it is a National Trust property, it may be worth considering the visit for a family day out. Unfortunately we were not able to arrange a visit through school as the dates available were not suitable for our school, timetable. May I emphasise again that this is by no means a requirement of the course.
