Reflect on what this means. • Know that the Bible is the Word of God. o Think of ways in which you can put the Word of God into practice. • Understand what happens at the Offertory. o Reflect on how some people prepare to make their offering. • Know that at the Consecration Jesus becomes truly present on the altar. o Think about what this means to you. • Understand the sacrifice Jesus made for us. o Reflect on how we can participate in it. • Know that when we receive Holy Communion, Jesus is truly present in the bread and wine. o Consider how we should prepare for this occasion • Reflect on how we can live out the Mass in our daily life. • Understand that Jesus is sacramentally present in the Blessed Sacrament. o Reflect on how that can help us.
